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Introduction

Planning a child's birthday party can be a joyful experience, but it can also feel overwhelming, especially if it's your first time or if you're juggling multiple little ones.

As a mum to a lively little girl, I've absolutely loved organising her birthday parties over the years - and I still do! From designing the invitations and thank-you cards, to carefully putting together goody bags, and right through to setting up on the day, I've taken great pleasure in managing every detail.

I also recognise my privilege in having the time to do all of this (and for just one child!) when so many busy parents are often coordinating two, three, or even more celebrations each year, all while balancing work and everything else life throws at them. Plus, not everyone loves to "wear a party hat" (pun intended! 😊) or finds joy in the planning process, and that's completely okay.

This guide isn't meant to be an exhaustive list of everything available, far from it! My aim is to provide you with a simple, practical starting point, take the pressure off, share what I've learned from both my event management background and my own experience as a mum, and help you feel a little more confident (and a lot less frazzled) about planning your child's next celebration.



Party options



Children's parties today come in every shape and size, with new ideas popping up constantly. Some popular options include:



Venue-based parties like trampoline parks, swimming pools, laser tag, bowling alleys, arcades, or soft play centres



Creative experiences such as arts & crafts workshops, teddy bear or beauty product making



Pamper parties at beauty parlours or mini spas



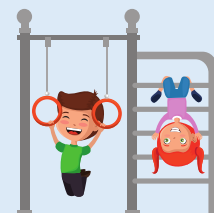
Fun and interactive experiences like petting zoos or garden centres



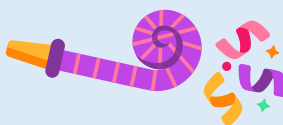
Entertainment-led parties with magicians, entertainers, or themed character visits



Energetic options such as gym or sports hall parties



Ready to get the party going?



Party

Whether you're planning a small celebration at home or going all out with a themed venue party, starting with the basics will give you a solid foundation. This is where you decide what kind of experience you want to create and what works best for your child and your family's schedule.

A few key decisions here will help the rest fall into place much more easily.



Decide what type of party you will have:

- Home party
- Themed party
- Dress up party
- Venue specific party
- Disco party
- Craft party
- Possibilities are endless!



Decide the day of the week, the date and the time for your party.



Is there a theme for the party?

Venue - if not at home

If you're hosting the party outside your home, choosing the right venue is key. Think about convenience, amenities, and the overall feel of the space. Some venues offer birthday party packages. If not, you can build your own party bit by bit!

Personal advice: a quick preview in person is always worth it, it helps avoid last-minute surprises and ensures everything runs smoothly on the day.



Check available options, considering:

- Availability
- Packages on offer
- Location
- Amenities like parking, kitchen area, cleaning supply, etc.



Select the venue (and package if applicable), confirm availability, agree costs and payment terms.



Arrange a visit to check details and spaces if possible.



When confirming party time, keep in mind set up time before the party and time for take down and cleaning after it.



Book the venue, confirming entry and exit times, rules and conditions, as well as any other requirements ahead of time.





Guests

Now for the fun part: the guest list!

- Whether you're inviting the whole class or keeping it small, it's best to plan early. Sending invites with plenty of notice will give parents time to RSVP, and thank you cards are a lovely touch to wrap things up after the big day.

Some party packages include invites and thank you messages, or templates to create yours, check with your venue and/or entertainer.


Don't forget to check for dietary, access and any other requirements with your guests to make it a great party for all.


-  Prepare a list of guests.
-  Find/Create invites to share physically or digitally.
-  Find/Create thank you cards these could be generic or tie up with the party theme.
-  Get invites out, giving guests enough time to plan.

Food & Drinks


Food doesn't have to be complicated, but it has to be planned! From allergies and dietary requirements to adult-friendly options, it's all about making sure everyone is catered for. Some party packages include food and drinks too - make sure you check with your venue and/or entertainer and agree/order beforehand.

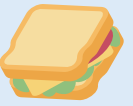
Don't forget the birthday cake! It's the star of the show and deserves a bit of early attention to get it just right.

 Confirm any dietary requirements or allergies early on. Chat with parents directly - they know best and will happily guide you so everyone can enjoy the party safely and stress-free (you included!).

 Popular Kid-friendly food options include sandwiches, veggie sticks, fruit, pizza slices, cocktail sausages and snacks. These are just suggestions, so pick what works best for your party.

 Remember drinks for the children, and if adults are staying, consider tea, coffee, soft drinks and light nibbles.

 Bake/Buy the birthday cake in advance based on guest count and consider an alternative for dietary restrictions.



Extras & Decoration

Decorations can really bring the party to life, especially if you're working with a theme. Check what's allowed at your chosen venue first (some have restrictions), then source or DIY your way to a beautifully styled setup.

A little prep in advance can save a lot of hassle later!

Please note: if purchasing custom items and/or purchasing online, keep production and delivery times into consideration!



Decide decorations for the venue (if not provided by the venue or included in the party package).



Check with the venue what decorations are acceptable (i.e.: can anything be stuck on walls? can anything be put outside? etc.).



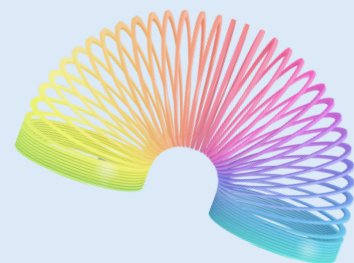
Source decorations



If food is handed in individual packages (like paper bags, boxes or similar), think of sourcing these too.



Goody Bags





Goody bags are a sweet way to thank your little guests for coming. Whether you're going with a themed selection or something simple, it's worth thinking ahead, especially if you're ordering them online or putting bags together yourself. Try to prep them a day or two before to avoid any last-minute faff.





Some party packages include goody bags too - make sure you check with your venue and/or entertainer and agree/order them beforehand.



Finally, if you're purchasing custom items and/or purchasing online, don't forget to check production and delivery times!



When you look for available options, keep in mind the theme of the party (if any), the age of the birthday child/ren and of most party guests, and birthday child/ren's preferences.



Purchase/order items to fill in the bag (if not buying pre-filled bags) and fill the bags ahead of the party.



Don't forget to add a slice of cake in them on the day!



On-the-Day Checklist

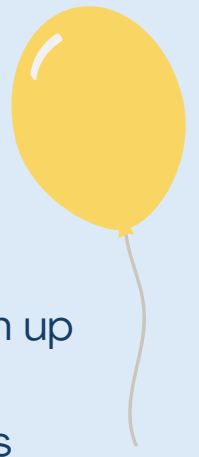


No one wants to be dashing back home for the candles! A simple checklist for the day of the party can save your sanity.

This handy list covers all the essentials to bring with you, making sure everything runs smoothly from setup to clean-up.

- Decorations for the venue
(if not provided by the venue)
- Food/drinks
(if not included in the party package)
- Goody bags
(if not provided by the venue)
- Bags/boxes to collect gifts
- Knife to cut cake
- Candles, lighter/matches
- Napkins and/or tin foil to wrap cake
slices for goody bags
- Cleaning supplies
(if needed/not provided by the venue)
- Bin bags/recycling bags to collect
rubbish
